

## **LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS No. 21 of 2025**

## **Disposing of Unwanted Marine Flares**

(This is a reissue of Local Notice to Mariners No. 65 of 2022, which is hereby cancelled)

**Notice is hereby given** that from 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022, HM Coastguard will no longer be offering a voluntary, public-facing flare disposal service to private individuals who have personal flares to dispose of. From that date, private individuals will need to use a third-party disposal service to dispose of their personal flares.

Information regarding registered disposal service providers can be found at <u>The Green Blue</u> website, which is hosted jointly between the RYA and British Marine.

Further information and guidance can be found in MIN 687: Changes to how individuals can dispose of redundant flares.

None of the CHC sites currently accept flares for disposal, therefore please **do not** leave any flares at the sites.

This local notice to mariners will remain in force until further notice.
